

## Year 5 Collective worship

### The Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes



During our recent collective worship, pupils read the scripture from the Old Testament (Exodus 20:1–17) and the New Testament of Matthews Gospel (Matthew 5:1–12). They reflected on the importance of the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes and how they guide us to live good and loving lives.

The children learned that the Ten Commandments help show us how to treat God and one another with respect, while the Beatitudes teach us about kindness, humility, and caring for those in need.

Through prayer and discussion, pupils thought about how they can follow these teachings in their daily lives by being kind, making good choices, and showing love to others.



## Year 5 Collective worship

Year Three, four, five and six gathered in collective worship with our school community to reflect on the most important events in the Christian calendar. Through liturgies, songs and acting the children learnt about key moments such as Palm Sunday, the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, the trial with Pontious Pilate and the events of Good Friday. Each year group helped bring the story to life, with Year 5 focusing on the trial of Jesus before Pontius Pilate. Through their thoughtful presentation, the children explored themes of justice, responsibility, and courage, helping everyone to better understand this significant moment in the Passion story. These times of worship have helped the pupils understand the values of sacrifice, compassion, and hope, while encouraging them to come together in prayer and reflection. We are proud to share these meaningful experiences with the children as they grow in faith and understanding.
