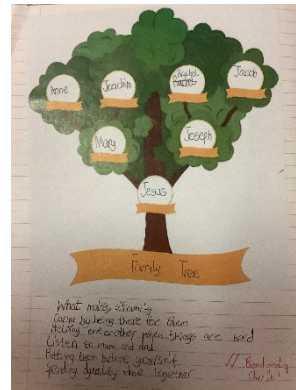


Creation and Covenant

Show an understanding of what a covenant is.

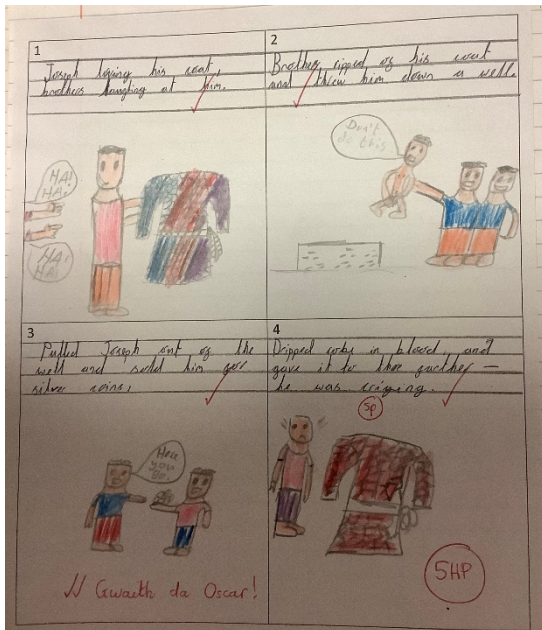
Abraham was faith-filled when he put his trust in God.

Explain about the great dock strike.

- In 1889, Cardinal Henry Edward Manning mediated the great dock strike in London.
- The strike began after an minor disagreement at the north-west India Dock on August 13, 1889.
- Manning was a trusted mediator between the dockers and the National Landowners.
- The strike ended on September 11, 1889 after a promise was made that the dock employees would meet the dockers' demands.
- The dockers received a pay rise from 5p to 6p per hour.

Faith: Cardinal Manning had faith in the employer to make the dockers pay higher.

Hope: He was hopeful the dock workers would get a better pay.

Love: He was loving by being a mediator and standing up for the dock workers.
