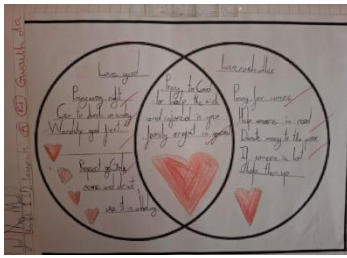


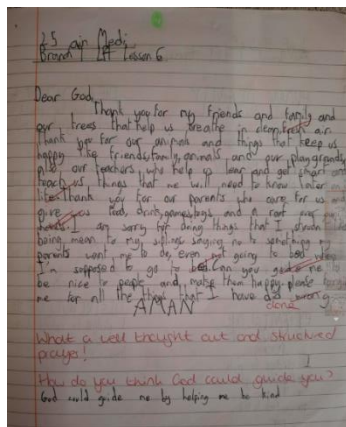
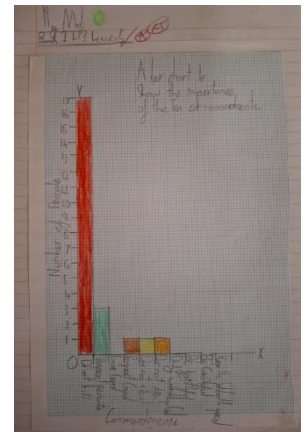
# Year 5 Autumn R.E.D

## Branch 1 - Creation and Covenant



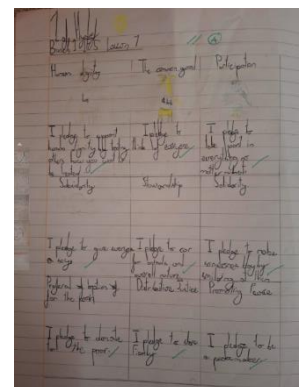
In this branch, pupils learned about Moses, focusing on two critical events in his life.. In the first event in Moses' life, where God revealed his name to Moses and Moses encountered God in the form of a burning bush. Pupils spent some time reflecting on the words

and imagery of the revelation to Moses. The children decided what commandment was most important to them and made links between the Ten Commandments and Jesus' summary of the law in Matthew's Gospel- the New Commandments. It was recognised that the Ten Commandments spoke to us today, but pupils also reflected on the context in which they appeared in the Bible.



The children were able to describe sin as deliberately spoiling our friendship with God and each other. The children were guided through a quiet reflection, asking them to think about times they may have sinned and how it affected their friendships. After, they created their own sorry prayers and were invited to share their prayers if they would like to.

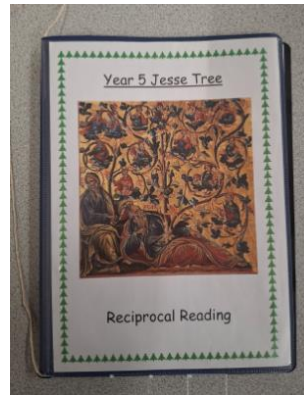
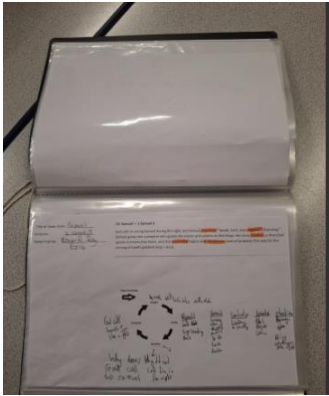
Children learned about Catholic Social Teaching, which is the body of teaching of the Catholic Church that guides how Christians are called to live justly in society. Rooted in Scripture and tradition, it emphasises the dignity of every human person, the pursuit of the common good, and responsibility for one another through solidarity. It teaches that the needs of the poor and vulnerable should be prioritised, that rights are balanced by responsibilities, and that decisions should be made at the most local level possible through subsidiarity. Catholic Social Teaching also stresses care for creation, calling people to be good stewards of the world. Together, these principles encourage believers to work for justice, peace, and human flourishing in all areas of life. The children created posters and pledges to go forward and live them in their own lives.



The children learned about the four virtues - prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance. The children created role plays to represent each in their daily lives.

## Branch 2 - The Prophecy and Promise

In this Branch, it taught the children to show understanding of the anointing of David and how David united his people when he became king. The children studied the scripture from Psalm 23. Psalm 23 describes God as a caring shepherd who provides, guides, protects, and stays with His people through every season of life; it teaches that even in times of fear, hardship, or opposition, God offers peace, direction, abundance, and faithful love, assuring believers that they are never abandoned and will ultimately live in lasting relationship with Him. The children created a pathway for the journey God set for us all.



The children had opportunities to show understanding that David was called by God to become a servant king and his faith in God allowed him to overcome fear and made links between the story of David's death, his advice to his Son Solomon and what makes a good leader. The children learned about God's promise to David about his life and the life of his descendants. The children studied the Jesse Tree Bible stories and

made a collaborative Jesse Tree Bok.



The children learned the carol 'O Come, O Come Emmanuel' and they explored how the O Antiphons are expressed through art around the world. The children created an Imovie to show each Antiphon.



The children explored and now understand the Rosary is a prayerful reflection on the life of Christ and explain what the joyful mysteries remember. We explored the Joyful Mysteries during our Outdoor Forest Lesson.
