Learning Focus 1: Lesson 1

Saint Damien

• Saint Damien of Molokai was born January 3, 1840 in Belgium and died April 15, 1889 in Hawaii. He died at the age of 49.

• His feast day is May 16th to celebrate his devotion to helping people with leprosy.

• He was moved by the miserable condition of those suffering from leprosy whom the Hawaiian government had deported to Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai, he volunteered to take charge of the settlement.

• In 1988/1989 Damien contracted leprosy and refused to leave for treatment. He succumbed to the painful, debilitating disease five years later.

• In 1965 Hawaii placed a statue of Damien in the National Statuary Hall. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1995 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.

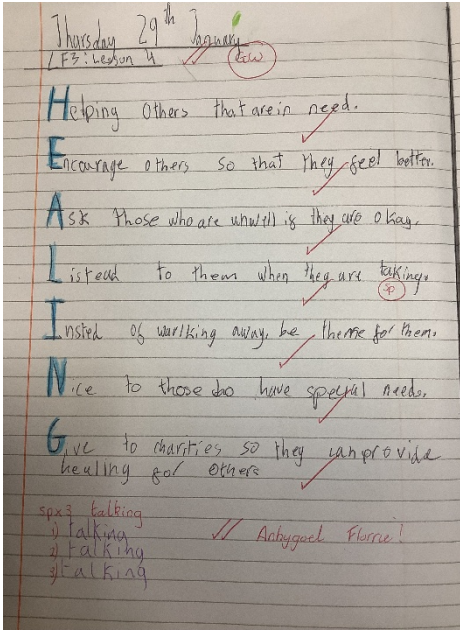

A child wrote how Jesus showed compassion, making links to scripture.

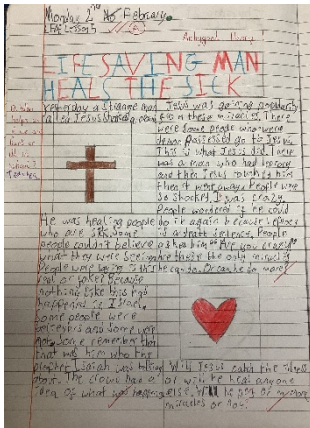
Learning Focus 3: Lesson 4

Learning Focus 4: Lesson 5



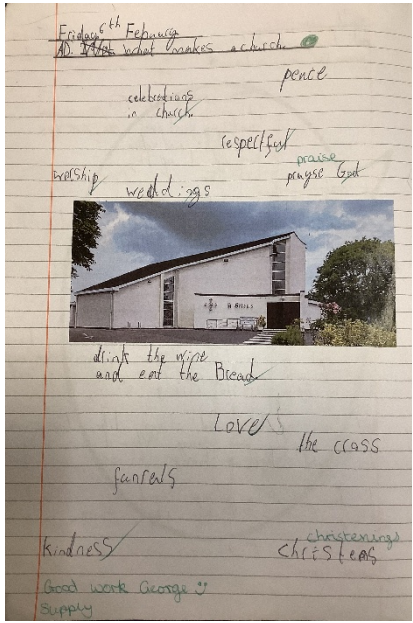
LO: I can make links between Jesus' speech to John the Baptist's followers and signs that he is the messiah.

Children wrote a newspaper article about Jesus performing miracles.

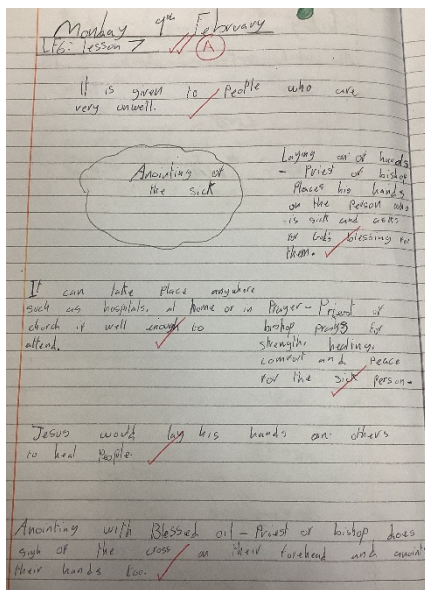
Learning Focus 5: Lesson 6
