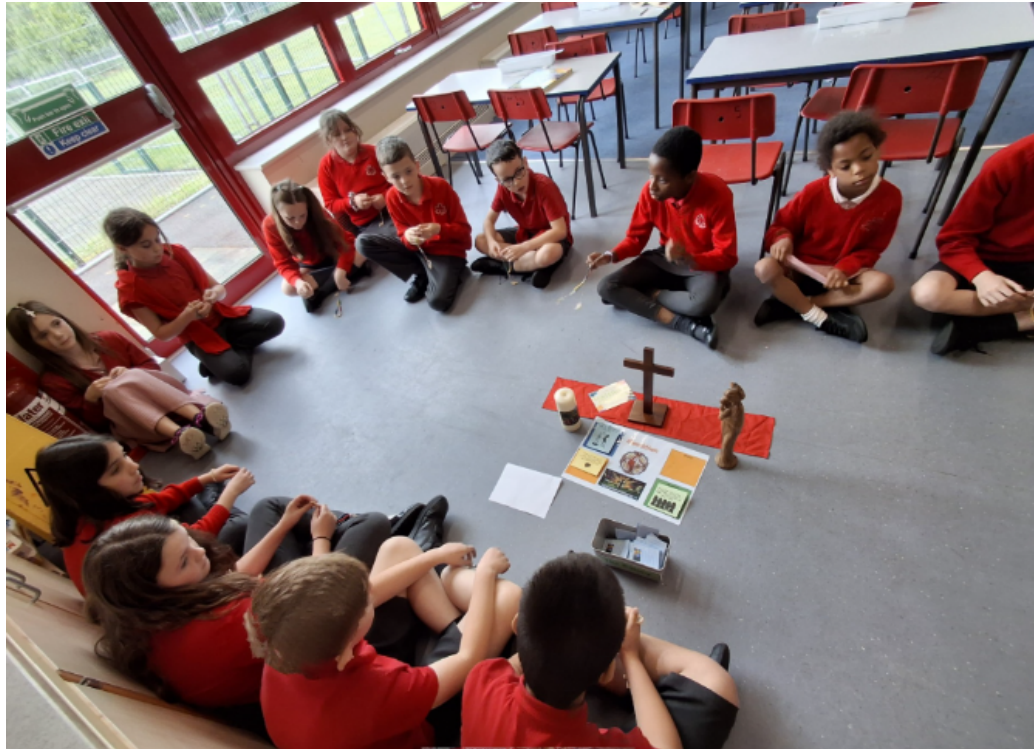


Collective Worship



In Collective Worship, some of the children took the lead in planning and delivering prayer opportunities for their classmates.

During the Month of Mary, they chose to pray the Rosary, reflecting on Mary's faith and devotion.

To celebrate Pentecost, the children dressed the central prayer focus in red to symbolise the fire of the Holy Spirit and to remind us of the Spirit's presence in our lives. Following the structure of Collective Worship, the children gathered together in prayer, listened to and reflected on the Pentecost Scripture, responded through prayer and reflection, and then went forth with a renewed sense of mission, considering how they could share the gifts of the Holy Spirit in their daily lives.



For the Feast of the Ascension, children from Year 3 to Year 6 gathered together for a special Collective Worship celebration. We reflected on the story of Jesus' Ascension into Heaven and listened to the Scripture account of this important event. The children responded by writing and sharing their own Prayers of the Faithful, praying for the needs of others and the wider world. As part of our mission, we reflected on Jesus' command to spread the Good News and used paper aeroplanes as a symbol of Jesus ascending to Heaven and of our call to carry His message to others. This meaningful act helped the children consider how they can live out their faith and share God's love in their everyday lives.
