

Collective Worship

During *Anti-Bullying Week*, the class took part in collective worship focused on kindness, respect, and treating others fairly. Pupils created *kindness wheels* showing practical ways to include others, use respectful language, and stand up for someone who feels left out. We shared examples together and encouraged pupils to put one action into practice during the week.



We took collective worship outdoors to reflect on creation and to show gratitude for the world *God* has given us. As part of this, pupils completed a creative activity where they worked together to **recreate the sun**, thinking about why light is important for life. Pupils shared thankfulness reflections and discussed how we can show respect and care for *God's* world.
