Themes: Eloquent and Truthful – pupils are growing to be eloquent and truthful in what they say of themselves, the relations between people, and the world.



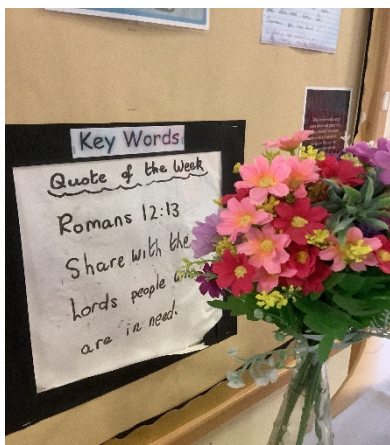
