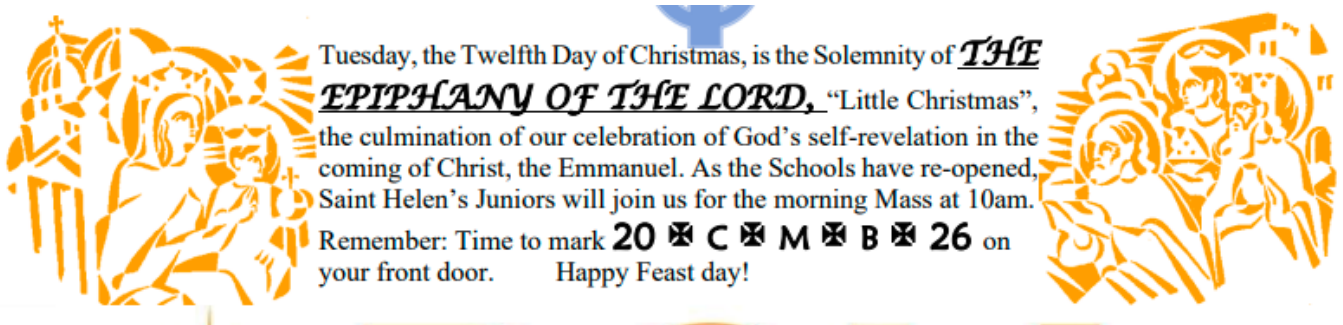


## Yr6 Spring Term 2026 Collective Worship

We had a class collective worship about the virtues of this half-term to ensure we understood what we were developing within ourselves. We shared the scripture:

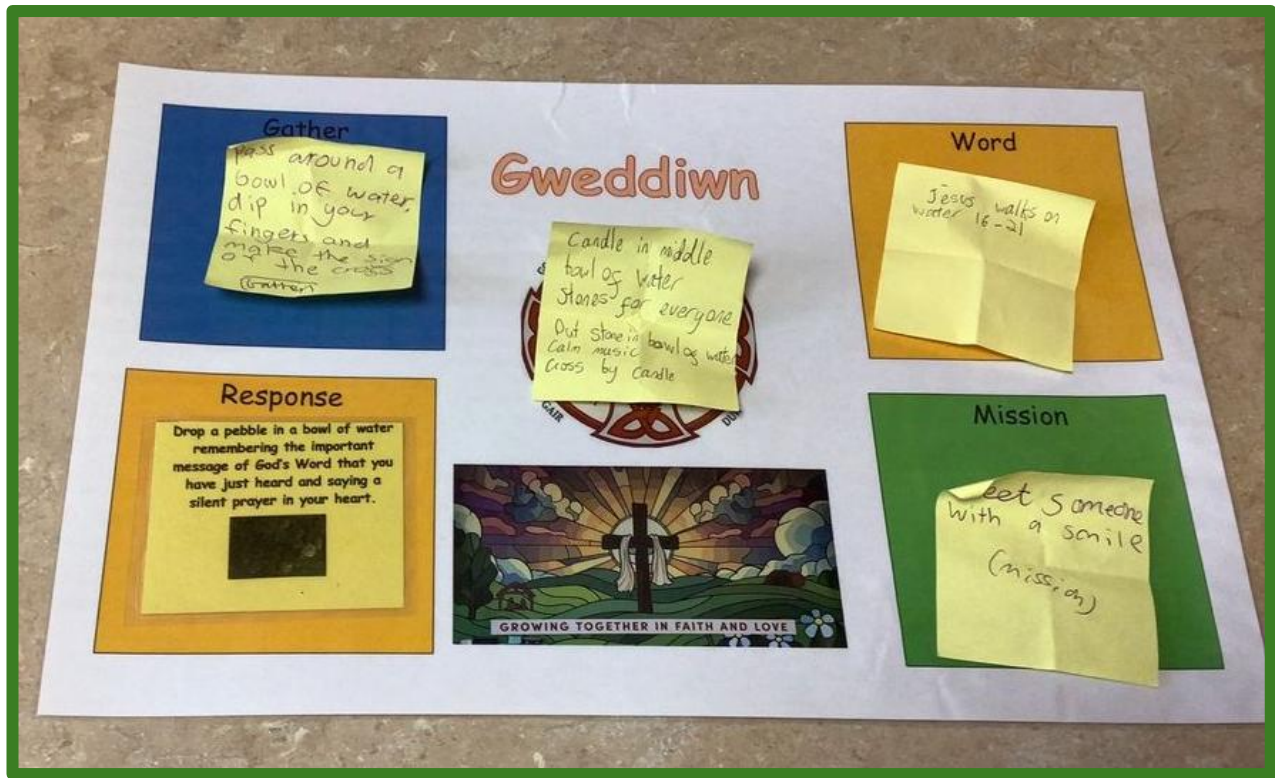
*Luke 11:28 Jesus said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"*
