During the first half term of this academic year the children have been working hard to develop and understand their virtues and values. During this half term we have focused on being curious and active.

We have tried to be curious about everything we are learning this half term.

This half term Year 2 have tried to use this curiosity to become active and engage with the world. Students have been learning about ways in which we can change the world for the better. Teaching staff have been leading pupils to be curious about God's world and all human activity within God's world.

Students have taken responsibility of their own learning by engaging in activities to look after God's world by planting vegetables and by litter picking on the foundation phase yard. Students have used these activities to ponder ideas about what they could be doing outside of school to be more active in the community.
